

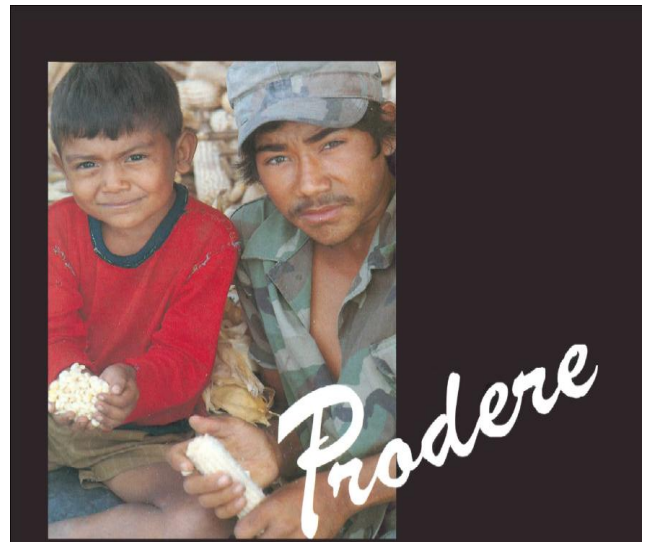
PRODERE

DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME FOR DISPLACED, REFUGEES AND RETURNEES IN CENTRAL AMERICA

Implemented from 1990 to 1995 in Central American countries directly or indirectly affected by armed conflict (Guatemala, Belize, Honduras, El Salvador, Nicaragua and Costa Rica), the PRODERE Programme has accompanied the peace process in the Region.

The Programme has adopted an innovative approach, working in the territories through development activities aimed at improving the living conditions of the entire local population, including displaced, refugees or demobilized groups.

The PRODERE Programme, funded by the Government of Italy has been carried out by UNDP, UNHCR, PAHO / WHO and ILO, through a unique team of regional work and in each country.
